

Have a clear purpose for using Office Hours to use time wisely.

- During your meeting:
 - Take Notes
 - Ask for further explanation if it doesn't make sense
 - Be honest if you are not fully understanding
 - Share a plan of how you will study moving forward and when you will attend office hours next




Resume and Career Tips
