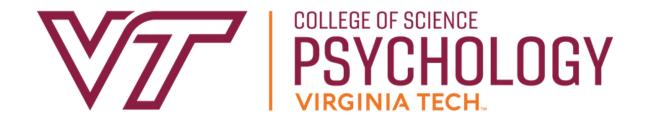

Searching for a Graduate Program

Have an idea of what kind of Psychology program you are looking for before you start your search, such as your preferred specialization.

Graduate School Application Process

- Applying to graduate school requires that you typically send in three professional letters of recommendation, your official VT transcript, a personal statement, your resume/CV, and sometimes a GRE score. However, requirements overall can differ from institution to institution.
